Full Proposal Project Narrative

Please do not: 1) delete questions [you can remove description after the boldface question category but do not delete the category itself (i.e., maintain Problem/Solution etc.)]; 2) change the numbering; 3) place narrative on your own template or letterhead; or 4) provide links to external electronic references in the body of the narrative. **(BFF reviewers are not able to access links to external electronic resources while working in the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation (NFWF) online system)**. When you have completed this narrative, upload it back into the Easygrants online system using “Uploads.”

1. **Problem/Solution.** Describe: a) the specific problem(s) to be addressed by the project; and b) how the project proposes to address the problem.

2. **Project Goals, Objectives and Priorities.** Describe: a) the goal(s) and objective(s) of the project and discuss how these goals/objectives will advance the goals and objectives of the BFF RFP; and b) the project metrics to be used to evaluate project success. *Project objectives and project metrics described in this project narrative should be specific, measureable, and realistic (attainable within the project’s period of performance). A list of all potential project metrics is found in the “Project Metrics” section of the BFF RFP.*

3. **Project Activities, Methods and Timeline.** a) Describe the project activities and how they address the project objectives. The project activities narrative must be detailed enough for reviewers to make a clear connection between the activities and the project costs. *(The project budget is not the budget for the entire project. It is only the budget requested from BFF)*; b) Provide a detailed description of the method(s) to be used to carry out each activity*; and c) Prepare a timeline indicating roughly when activities or project milestones are to be accomplished (see suggested table format below, though other timeline forms are acceptable). The timetable should not propose specific dates but instead group activities by month(s) over the entire project period.

For entities applying for a Category 2: WNS Innovative Treatment Grants, a) provide a short (1-2 paragraph) description about how the innovative treatment or management strategy either builds on efforts in other fields of research or can otherwise be explained based on current understanding of WNS disease ecology; and b) why you believe the proposed project has relevance to provide a tool with the potential to produce a new mechanism or application to address *Pd* and/or WNS in bats.

5. **Qualifications.** Provide a concise written description of the following: a) organizational, individual staff, and all cooperating entities and individuals qualifications and experience relevant to delivery of the proposed research project; and b) their specific role and responsibilities in delivery of major project activities. *(Please do not substitute or upload information into the Easygrants application in the form of CVs or resumes with the exception of the Principal Investigator (PIs). For PIs please provide information as requested in this question; and also provide a no greater than 1-2 page CV into the "Uploads" section of the NFWF Easygrants online application.*

6. **Transferability/Communication.** Describe how you plan to: a) transfer project results to real-world bat conservation, including a realistic assessment of costs and effort needed to implement the strategy at the population-level scale, and integrate/communicate findings into government programs and policies; and b) communicate information about the project to appropriate audiences including but not limited to professional associations and/or peer-reviewed publications.
