OVERVIEW

The National Fish and Wildlife Foundation (NFWF), in partnership with the Bureau of Reclamation, the Bureau of Land Management, the U.S. Forest Service and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, announced the 2018 funding for the Lahontan Cutthroat Trout (LCT) program. Two projects were awarded a total of \$724,905, leveraging \$734,000 in match from grantees and generating a total conservation impact of more than \$1.45 million. The program launched in 2010 and seeks to create large interconnected strongholds of Lahontan cutthroat trout that are resilient to drought, fire and stream warming, while protecting populations from non-native trout that compete or hybridize with them.

Lahontan cutthroat trout are the only native trout in the Great Basin, including Nevada and parts of California, Oregon and Utah. Following decades of decline, the species was listed under the Endangered Species Act in 1973. Since NFWF's program began, nine populations have been secured through a combination of reintroduction and barrier placement protecting from non-native trout invading recovery streams. Non-native trout have also been removed from 267 miles of Lahontan cutthroat trout habitat to date.
