OVERVIEW

The National Fish and Wildlife Foundation (NFWF) announced 13 grant awards through the National Wildlife Refuge Friends Program, a collaborative effort between NFWF and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. The awards were made to 13 National Wildlife Refuge Friends organizations across the country to support on-the-ground projects, capacity building efforts and increased hunting and fishing experiences within the refuge system. NFWF awarded \$115,206.95 in grant funding that leverages \$232,956.50 in matching funds, generating a total conservation impact of \$348,163.45. The National Wildlife Refuge Friends Program provides competitive grants that enable Friends organizations to develop and implement conservation projects, strengthen organizational capacity and skills, meet local refuge challenges, and build community recognition and support.
