OVERVIEW

The National Fish and Wildlife Foundation (NFWF) and Pūlama Lāna'i announced a 2021-year round of funding for the Kuahiwi a Kai: Lāna'i Watershed Conservation Program. Three new natural resource conservation and community engagement grants totaling \$409,286 were awarded. The three awards announced generated \$402,340 in match from the grantees, providing a total conservation impact of \$811,626.

The Kuahiwi a Kai: Lāna'i Watershed Conservation Program was developed to strategically preserve and enhance Lāna'i's unique natural and cultural resources from mauka to makai (from the top of the mountain down to the ocean), while encouraging community engagement and shared stewardship. The awarded projects take a comprehensive approach to land management to achieve the goals of the program.
