# Texas Coastal Adaptive Management

Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) will establish a program to support adaptive management actions needed to maintain, repair or rehabilitate projects funded by GEBF, including repair of damages from storms, vessel strikes or other causes. Additionally, these funds will allow Texas resource agencies, lead by TPWD and partners, to adaptively manage existing GEBF projects to enhance or expand ecological benefits and ensure their long-term sustainability in the face of dynamic conditions, as well as unforeseen circumstances (e.g. structure modifications, supplemental plantings, etc.). Lastly, these funds might be used to expand the scope of GEBF-funded projects and leverage future investments made by Texas natural resource partners to maximize conservation outcomes for the Texas Coast.

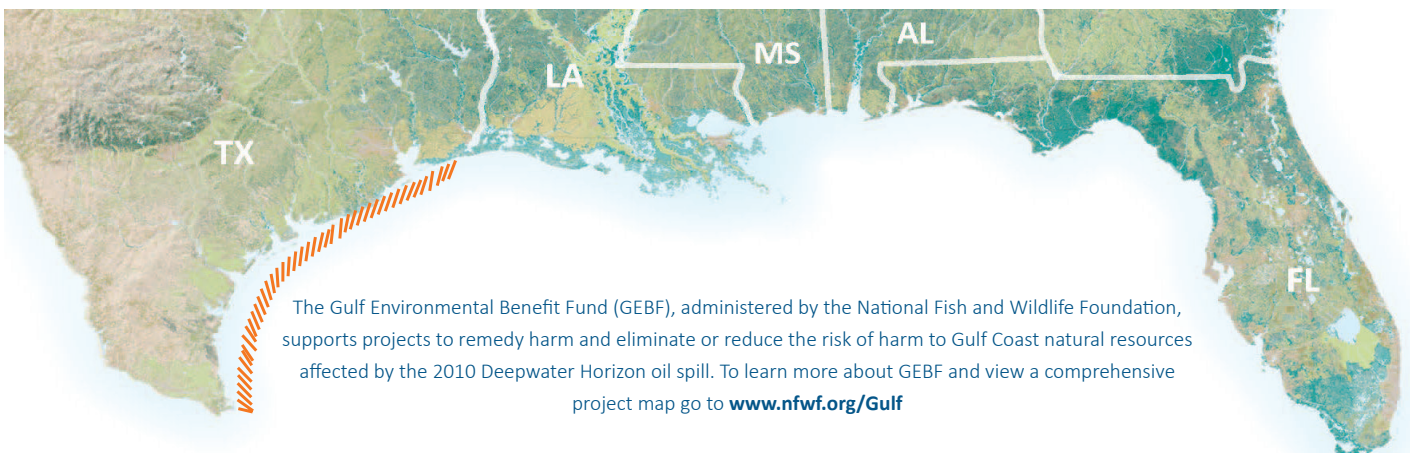
