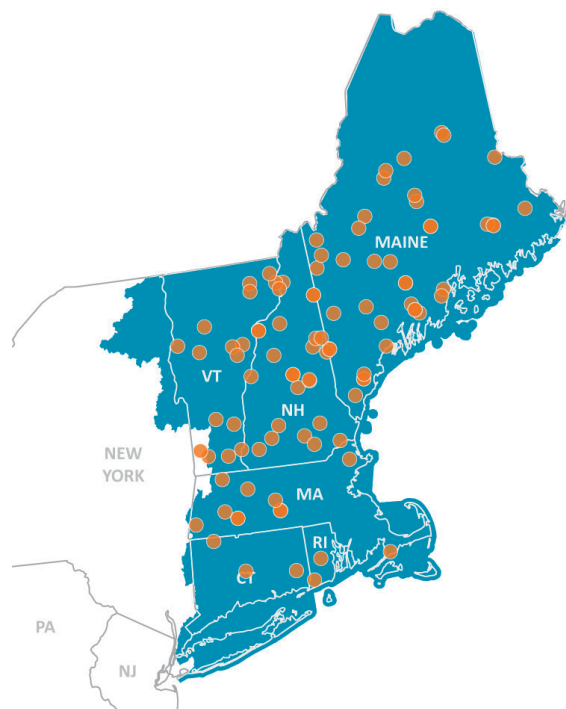

BACKGROUND

The New England Forests and Rivers Fund is dedicated to restoring and sustaining healthy forests and rivers that provide habitat for diverse native bird and freshwater fish populations in the New England states, Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island and Vermont, plus the Upper Hudson and Lake Champlain watersheds in New York. This program annually awards competitive grants ranging from \$50,000 to \$200,000 each.

From 2015 through 2021, the program has awarded over \$10.3 million in grant funds, matched by over \$18.4 million from grantees for a total conservation impact of more than \$28.7 million, to 85 grants that will restore early successional and mature forest habitat, modify and replace barriers to fish movement, restore riparian and instream habitat, and engage hundreds of volunteers in forest habitat restoration and stream connectivity projects.
