
ABOUT NFWF

OVERVIEW

The Midwest Cover Crop Initiative is a public-private partnership that accelerates large-scale, voluntary adoption of cover crops across several Midwestern states. Newly launched in 2022 with support from ADM and the USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), the initiative awards grants to provide outreach and technical assistance to facilitate multi-year financial assistance contracts with farmers. Through this support, the initiative aims to enhance soil health, reduce atmospheric greenhouse gases, and improve water and wildlife resources while providing economic benefits to participating farmers.

In 2022, the Midwest Cover Crop Initiative awarded five grants totaling \$2.6 million to help farmers plant cover crops across Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Michigan and Minnesota. These five grants will support implementation of this beneficial agricultural practice on 500.000 acres.
