Alabama Coastal Adaptive Management

The Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (ADCNR) will establish a program to support adaptive management actions for the continued maintenance, repair, rehabilitation, or replacement of active projects funded by GEBF (including repair of damages from storms, vessel strikes, or other causes). Additionally, these funds will allow Alabama resource agencies, led by ADCNR, to adaptively manage existing GEBF projects (through structure modifications, supplemental plantings, etc.) to enhance or expand ecological benefits and ensure their long-term sustainability in the face of dynamic conditions, as well as unforeseen circumstances. Lastly, these funds might be used to expand the scope of GEBF-funded projects and leverage future investments made by Alabama natural resource partners to maximize conservation outcomes.

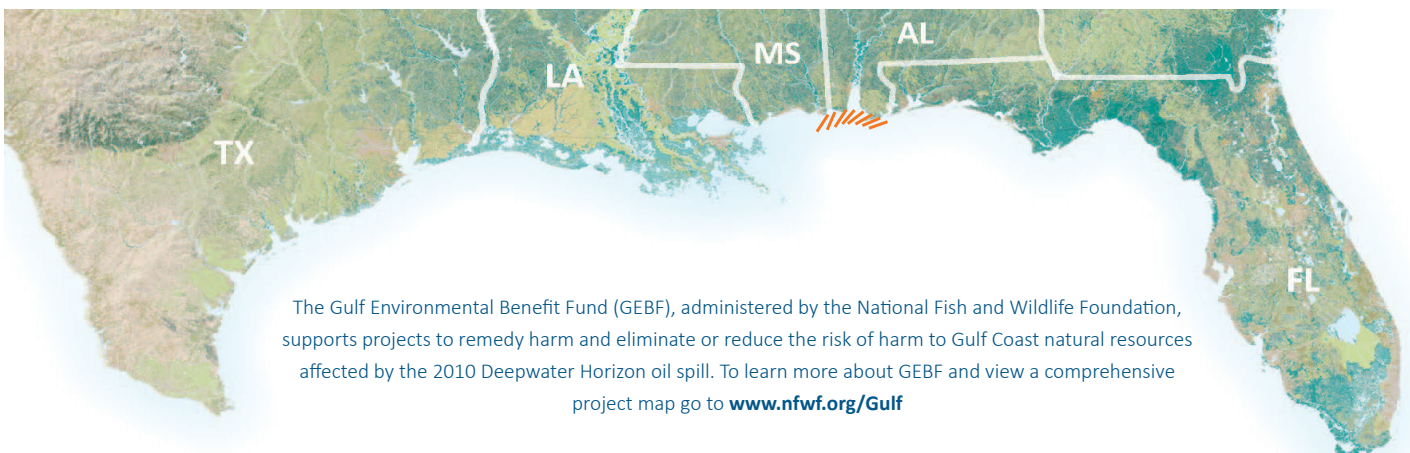
