

# Long Island Sound Futures Fund 2024 Full Proposal Tip Sheet

## STARTING AN APPLICATION

When you are ready to begin the application process, go to easygrants.nfwf.org.

- New users to the system will be prompted to register before starting their application.
- Existing users should log in using their e-mail address and password. If you have forgotten your password, please click the "Forgot your password?" link on the Easygrants login page and a reset link will be sent to you. The link expires within 24 hours of being sent.
- Once you are logged in, click the **Apply for Funding** button, and select **Long Island Sound Futures Fund 2024** from the list of "Available Funding Opportunities".
- Complete the Eligibility Quiz and Save and Submit your response.
- If you pass the Eligibility Quiz, Easygrants will return you to your personal Easygrants Home Page. From there, click on the Full-Proposal for the Long Island Sound Futures Fund 2024. Now you are ready to get started! If you do not pass the Eligibility Quiz, please contact the NFWF Program Contact identified in the RFP.

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#### Take Note!

- **Pop-ups:** Easygrants uses pop-up windows to display some files. Please make sure your web browser allows for pop-ups. The internet browser pop-up blocker must be disabled prior to beginning the application process. You can also try holding the Shift or Control (CTRL) key when clicking the link.
- **Cookies:** Easygrants uses cookies to maintain the session information. Please make sure that your browser and computer can accept cookies.
- **PDF:** Easygrants uses PDFs extensively. Make sure you are able to use Adobe Reader.
- SAVING AND SUBMITTING: Once an application has been initiated, it may be saved and then modified and submitted at a later time, up to the application deadline of May 13, 2024 11:59 PM Eastern Standard Time. Please note DO NOT hit the "Submit" button until you are actually ready to submit. Once you hit submit the application is formally submitted and you may no longer make changes.

## **PROJECT INFORMATION**

- **Project Title:** Please do not call your project "Long Island Sound Futures Fund Proposal". Give it a short, descriptive name that will distinguish it from other proposals and indicate project purpose. (300 character limit, including spaces). Examples from prior LISFF proposals:
  - o Stormwater and Green Infrastructure Improvements in Downtown Naugatuck (CT)
  - o Planning to Enhance Coastal Resiliency with Tidal Marsh Restoration at Sunken Meadow Park (NY)
  - o Marine Debris Education for High School Students in Coastal Communities of Long Island Sound (CT)
- Project Start Date: Projects must start within six months after notification of grant award. Project start dates for school-based projects may be adjusted to reflect the school year. A Project start date cannot be before October 1, 2024.
- Project End Date: A majority of projects must be completed within 24 months after notification of grant award. Larger-scale complex implementation must start within six months and be completed within thirty-six months after notification of the grant award. Project completion dates for school-based projects may be adjusted to reflect the school year. However, these projects *must* be completed within thirty-six months after notification of grant award. Notification of award is projected to be November 2024.
- Description: Should be two sentences in most cases. The first sentence should clearly state the main activity/method being used to deliver the project. The second sentence should state the expected outcome from the investment and relevance to conservation. Please refrain from using pronouns such as I, we, our, etc. (1,000 character limit, including spaces). Examples from prior Long Island Sound Futures Fund grants:
  - Modify bridge culverts to restore fish passage on the Noroton River at I-95 between the Town of Darien and City of Stamford, Connecticut. Project will provide access to 4.9 miles of migratory riverine corridor habitat for spawning of river herring.
  - Install 8,400 sq. ft. of green infrastructure in the Town of Mamaroneck, New York. Project will treat 698,662 gallons of stormwater runoff and prevent 319.6 lbs. of marine debris flowing annually from the Mamaroneck Town Center into Mamaroneck Harbor to improve water quality in the Harbor and Long Island Sound.
  - Collect marine debris with eight paddle and pickup canoe trips, trash collection at a river boom, and a shoreline cleanup along the Bronx River, New York. Project will collect 4,500 pounds of floatable debris and other trash involving 200 volunteers.
- Abstract: Provide a more detailed description of your project including: primary project purpose, problem the project seeks to address, how the project will address the problem, major project activities, outcomes (deliverables at the end of the grant period) and project partners. Please refrain from using pronouns such as I, we, our, etc. (1500 character limit, including spaces). Examples from prior Long Island Sound Futures Fund grants:
  - Restore a 12-acre coastal forest by eradicating invasive plants and planting of native trees, shrubs and herbs at the Otter Creek Preserve, Village of Mamaroneck, New York. The 35-acre preserve hosts 21 acres of tidal marsh and the coastal forest along the Long Island Sound shore. The marsh and forest is a magnet for 100 species of birds including warblers, vireos, thrush, flycatchers, and raptors. While some of the forest at the Preserve is in good ecological condition, invasive plants are degrading the ecosystem. At risk is the preserve's ability to support forest dwelling migratory birds. The project will focus on six of the coastal forest's 12 acres to reverse forest fragmentation/degradation. The project will: 1) remove invasive trees Norway maples and tree of heaven, three acres of invasive plants and ~1000 invasive vines; and replant ~560 native trees/shrubs/herbaceous plants; 2) provide education on the organization website, social media and in the press and on partner websites to 10,000 households; and 3) work with three partners offering six field trips for 195 students from local and low-income underserved communities to teach about the Sound's ecology. The project will result in a forest with increased structural complexity and improved wildlife habitat. Partners: Sheldrake Nature Center, The Nature Conservancy, Atmosphere Academy, Village of Mamaroneck, and Federated Conservationists of Westchester County.
  - Install a facility to improve manure management reducing nitrogen and phosphorus pollution discharging from farm operations into Pease brook and ultimately downstream to Long Island Sound. The USDA and U.S. Environmental Protection Agency released the joint *Unified National Strategy for Animal Feeding Operations* which supports implementation of site-specific comprehensive nutrient management plans (CNMPs) to minimize impacts on water quality and public health. Pease brook has impaired water quality for fish, wildlife

and aquatic species and recreation. This project will construct the facility based upon an NRCS CNMP. The project will enhance manure management of 200 cows at the farm by installing a covered waste storage facility that eliminates outdoor manure exposure to rainwater and discharges from the farm to low-lying land and water. The project will prevent 29,798 lbs. of nitrogen and 36,665 lbs. of phosphorus annually from the farm to Pease brook and the Sound. Project partners include a dairy farmer and the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Natural Resources Conservation Service.

- Construct a living shoreline to enhance re-establishment of up to one acre of salt marsh, and enhance 13 acres of coastal grassland, forest and upland at Alley Pond Park in Douglaston, New York. The salt marshes along Alley Creek are home to a unique native ecosystem. Over 11 acres of shoreline marsh have been lost in this park since 1974, equivalent to a decrease of more than 22% of the original marsh area. This loss illustrates a trend that is occurring throughout New York City, where over 160 acres of shoreline marsh have disappeared in the last 40 years. The project will address these losses by focusing on the drivers of erosion and reduce the impacts of sea level rise by constructing a living breakwater shoreline structure. This breakwater will reduce frequent, low-level wave energies and change nearshore hydraulics. This will promote sediment deposition behind the structure while also providing habitat for aquatic life. The project will: 1) implement the first phase of a pilot living shoreline (200 to 400 linear feet) using a combination of oyster castles, rip rap, and shell bags or baskets; 2) enhance 13 acres of coastal grassland, shrubland and forest through invasive vegetation control and planting of native species; and 3) conduct up to three events for living shoreline construction engaging 90 community stewards from local environmental and education focused non-profits. Once installed, the project features will protect the existing salt marsh and promote its reestablishment. Project partners include the Alley Pond Environmental Center.
- **Requested Amount:** Grant requests must be between \$50,000 and \$1,500,000 (please review the <u>Request for</u> <u>Proposals</u> for categories of funding).

- The "Requested Amount" in the Project Information section must match your budget grand total exactly. The budget should only represent the grant amount being requested from NFWF; it should not include matching funds or represent the overall budget for the project.
- Project budgets will be compared to similar projects to ensure proposed costs across all budget categories are reasonable for the activities being performed and the outcomes proposed.

Indirect Costs: If you intend to include indirect costs in your budget, please review NFWF's Indirect Cost Policy.

- The federal government has determined that a *de minimis* 10% indirect rate is an acceptable minimum for organizations without a NICRA.
- If you are including indirect costs in your budget request, please provide a narrative description identifying what the indirect request will be supporting (e.g., CEO salary, rent for lab space central to project site, etc.).
- Indirect cost narratives should include a statement of whether the applicant has ever had a NICRA. If the applicant has a NICRA, it shall include supporting documentation.
- Budgets without narrative descriptions for indirect costs may be rejected and/or returned to the applicant for further details and clarification.

#### **MATCHING CONTRIBUTIONS**

All applicants must provide **nonfederal** matching contributions of at least 50% of the total grant amount requested from LISFF (i.e., if you request \$100,000 then the **required nonfederal** match is \$50,000). Contribution of **nonfederal** match that is greater than the required minimum match will be scored higher in this category. Please see the "Evaluation Criterion," section of the LISFF 2024 RFP for the breakdown.

Click the "Add" button to add sources of nonfederal and any federal matching contributions, and list each source separately in the space provided. Match consists of the portion of project costs not paid with NFWF funds and may be in the form of cash, in-kind or volunteer contributions. Nonfederal match must meet all of the following criteria:

#### **PERMITS and APPROVALS**

## **REVIEW and SUBMIT**

When you are ready to submit, each section of your proposal should be indicated "Complete" with a green check mark  $(\checkmark)$  in the "Status" column. If any section is indicated "Incomplete" with a red  $(\Join)$ , you will not be able to submit and must go back and check your work in each section that is "Incomplete". The Validation Status section in the Review and Submit section of the application explains why the system indicates a section is "Incomplete".

To view and save your proposal you may click on the "View PDF" button. This function creates a composite file with all of the fields and substantive uploads, which you may then save as a stand-alone document. Please note that some of the

financial documentation will be excluded from the composite file, but will be received by NFWF upon submission. Once you have reviewed your proposal for accuracy, click the "Submit" button to officially submit your proposal. Upon submission, you will receive a confirmation email from <a href="mailto:Easygrants@nfwf.org">Easygrants@nfwf.org</a>.

# FREQUENTLY ASKED EASYGRANTS QUESTIONS

## 1. How do I get back into the Easygrants online system when locked out?

Please send an email to Easygrants Helpdesk (<u>Easygrants@nfwf.org</u>) with your name, easygrants ID #, e-mail address, phone number, program you are applying to, and a description of the issue.

## 2. I forgot my Easygrants password. How do I get this information sent to me?

Please go to <u>easygrants.nfwf.org</u>, click the "Forgot your password?" link, enter your e-mail address as the Login ID, and click Submit. Easygrants will e-mail you a copy of your login information. Please note that the reset password link expires after 24 hours of being sent. If it has been longer than 24 hours since the initial request you will have to request another link in order to reset your password. If you are unable to log in after having attempted to reset your password please send an email to Easygrants Helpdesk (<u>Easygrants@nfwf.org</u>) with your name, easygrants ID #, e-mail address, phone number, program you are applying to, and a description of the issue.

# 3. I have finished my proposal and it is not showing up as completed.

Please remember to hit the "submit" button in the Review and Submit section of the application when you have completed the application. When a task is properly submitted in easygrants the task will no longer be visible on the user's homepage.

## 4. How will I know when NFWF has received my completed application?

You will receive an automated notification from Easygrants@nfwf.org.

## 5. I completed the application and it will not submit. Why not?

If you are unable to submit your application, go to the Review and Submit form in the application. If any section is indicated "Incomplete" with a red ( $\times$ ), there will also be an explanation as to why the system indicates the section is "Incomplete". You must go back and check your work in each section that is "Incomplete". Below are two examples that frequently prevent submission:

- Check the Project Information section of the Easygrants online application "Requested Amount" to see if it matches your budget grand total. The amounts must match **exactly** (down to the cent) for you to be able to submit a proposal. Please edit your Requested Amount and/or budget if needed.
- 2) Do not complete sections of the budget where you have no costs. If you entered "0" for any budget line items, delete those line items. Placing a "0" in these line items will prevent you from submitting a proposal.

# 6. What should I do if a page crashes in Easygrants?

If you receive a System Encountered Error it is important to follow the instructions on the page

- 1) First, click **Resume** and you should return to the previous page. Check if the action you tried to complete occurred. If the action did not complete, make a note of what page you are on and what button or link you are clicking.
- 2) Retry the action. If the system crashes again you must click the Send an E-mail to report the issue. This will open a Send Error Message E-mail page in a new window or tab. Do not skip these steps and e-mail Easygrants Helpdesk yourself; we need the information in this e-mail to resolve your issue.
- 3) In the email to Easygrants Helpdesk, please enter your name, easygrants ID #, e-mail address, phone number, and a description of what happened. The description needs to include what page you were on, what data you may have typed into the page, what button/link you clicked, and what you were trying to do.
- 4) Click **Submit** to send the message and report the error. This will be sent to the NFWF Easygrants Helpdesk along with additional technical information sent by Easygrants.

# 7. I need to download a copy of my submitted proposal.
