OVERVIEW

The National Fish and Wildlife Foundation (NFWF) announced 18 grant awards through the National Wildlife Refuge Friends Grant Program, a collaborative effort between NFWF and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, to 17 National Wildlife Refuge Friends organizations across the country to support on-the-ground projects, capacity building work, peer-to-peer conferences, and increasing hunting and fishing experiences within the refuge system. The more than \$149,000 NFWF awarded in grants will leverage \$288,500 in match, generating a total conservation impact of more than \$437,500.

The National Wildlife Refuge and Friends Grant Program provides competitive grants that enable Friends organizations to develop and implement conservation projects, strengthen organizational capacity and skills, meet local refuge challenges, and build community recognition and support.
