OVERVIEW

The National Fish and Wildlife Foundation (NFWF) announced 15 grant awards through the National Wildlife Refuge Friends Program, a collaborative effort between NFWF and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service with additional support from Enbridge. The awards were made to 15 National Wildlife Refuge Friends organizations across the country to support on-the-ground projects, capacity building efforts, peer-to-peer conferences and and increased hunting and fishing experiences within the refuge system. NFWF awarded more than \$158,000 in grant funding that leverages \$320,000 in matching funds, generating a total conservation impact of more than \$478,000. The National Wildlife Refuge Friends Program provides competitive grants that enable Friends organizations to develop and implement conservation projects, strengthen organizational capacity and skills, meet local refuge challenges, and build community recognition and support.
